Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL)

- Quarantine-free entry will be accorded to **vaccinated travellers** on VTL Flights
- Uni-directional (that is only from **applicable countries to Singapore**)

NEW First launched to Germany and Brunei, now expanded to **11 more countries**.

Travellers will be allowed to transit through Singapore on VTL flights (to any country), **if they meet all applicable VTL eligibility requirements**

***Note**

- VTL is one directional for Australia to Singapore only. Entry into Australia remains restricted to Australian citizens, or permanent residents and their immediate families, as well as foreign nationals who hold a valid visa and a travel exemption
- VTL arrangement with Switzerland is both ways into Zurich and to Singapore



VTL Eligibility Criteria and Requirements

To enjoy Quarantine-Free Travel:

- Travel from Singapore to VTL countries → Can be on any SQ flight to these VTL countries
- Travel from VTL countries to Singapore → Must be on designated Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL) flights

Most VTL countries provide Quarantine and Test-Free entry to vaccinated travellers from Singapore

Some exception apply.

Reminder: Always check requirements, including any restrictions on age & vaccination status for the **Entire Planned Itinerary**, including the VTL country, or any other multiple destinations.

Singapore → Italy [According to the Ordinance of 22Oct21 valid from 26Oct21- 15Dec21]

For entry/return to Italy, if in the previous 14 days you have stayed/transited in a country on list D (Singapore) ,

Following requirements apply:

- *Fill in the digital location form, also called the digital Passenger Locator Form (dPLF)*
- *Present the "green" COVID-19 certification or equivalent certification to the carrier, at the time of boarding,*
- *Negative PCR test carried out in the 72 hours prior to arrival in Italy.*

VTL Eligibility

Effective 19th Oct (From 1st New VTL Flight)

Effective from VTL flights arriving o/aft 01NOV 2021, changes to requirements for transit (TT) passengers

VTL Requirements

For Eligible Passengers

2 Covid-19 PCR Tests to be taken for All VTL Flight passengers entering Singapore:

- **1. Pre-departure PCR Test [also applicable to Passengers who transit through SIN on VTL flight]**
 - To be taken within -48 hours before scheduled flight departure date.
Example: Passengers departing on 4 Oct can take the test any time from 2 Oct onwards, regardless of passenger's flight departure time on 4 Oct
 - Negative COVID-19 test results
 - Certificate in English
- **2. On arrival PCR Test at Changi Airport (OAT)**
 - To pre-book with payment. SGD 160 before GST <https://www.changiairport.com>
 - Test result to be out within 24 hours from the time it was taken.
 - Passenger will receive message from Safe Travel Office in Singapore confirming results
 - Passenger to remain self-isolated until test result is confirmed negative
 - Infant (based on calendar year) are exempted from PCR Test

For Pax on Transit thru SIN on VTL flights

- To meet VTL eligibility for **TT Passengers** (as covered in previous slide)
- Only Pre-departure PCR Test will apply under VTL requirements

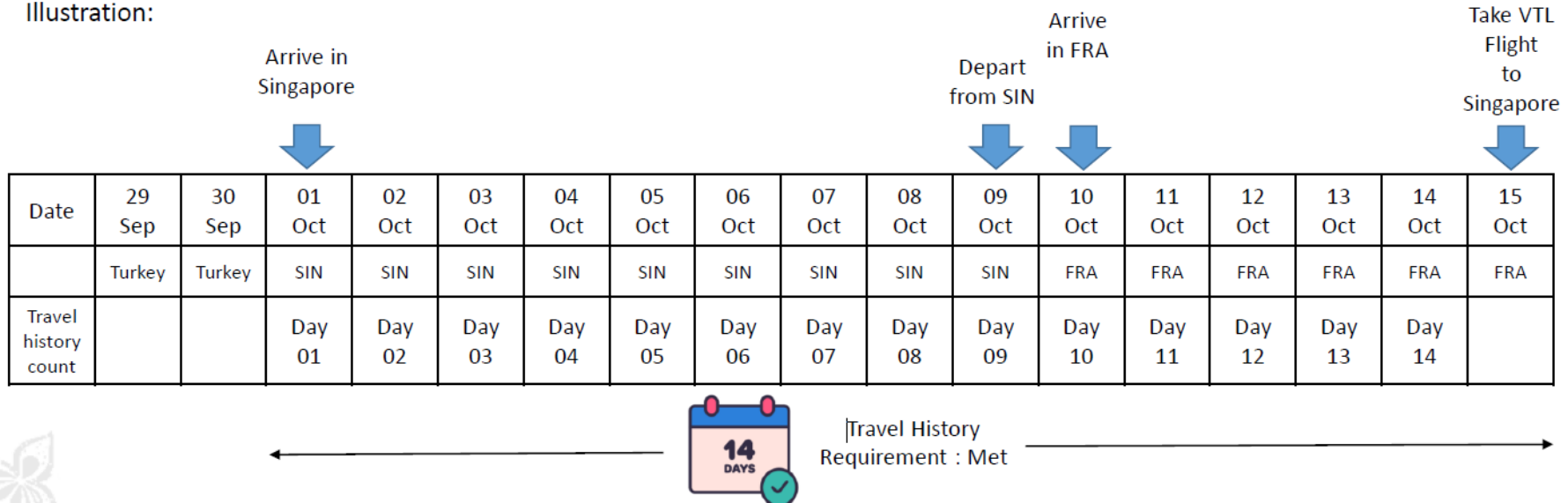
For Pax departing from Singapore to Brunei:
Further entry documentation may be required

Travel History Check

How to count 14-day eligible travel history

Illustration:



How to count 14-day eligible travel history:

Passenger can take VTL flight if departure is D. And the last 14 consecutive days refer to D-14 to D

- Examples: 1- 15 Oct, 22 Oct – 5 Nov
- **Important to take note that the travel history between D-14 to D MUST NOT contain any non-VTL country**

Travel History Check







Where have you been in the last 14 days from the departure date of VTL flight?

Recap:

- Day of arrival to VTL country or Singapore does not count towards the travel history
- Day of departure from Singapore or VTL country counts to the travel history

Red = non VTL country

Green = VTL country / Singapore - Eligible travel history

Scenario (Travel History in chronological sequence)	Can take VTL flight?	Reason
12 days in Brunei → 9 days in Singapore → 5 days in Germany		Eligible travel history = 14 days

Proof of Vaccination Requirements for Vaccinations Certificates

Vaccination certificates are a pre-requisite for VTL flights (into Singapore)
Final dose to be completed at least 14 days prior to arrival in Singapore

Requirements for Vaccination Certificates



Certificates issued by Singapore or any VTL country (regardless of which VTL country the passenger will depart from) will be recognized namely:
E.g. Pax departing from UK can show an EU DCC issued in another VTL country. Pax departing from US can show an NHS COVID pass issued in UK

4 Key Points

1 Entry Requirements & Vaccination Certificate Requirements

May differ for each VTL country, please check the Singapore Airlines website and / or respective embassies for requirements and clarifications

2 Entire Planned Itinerary need to be considered

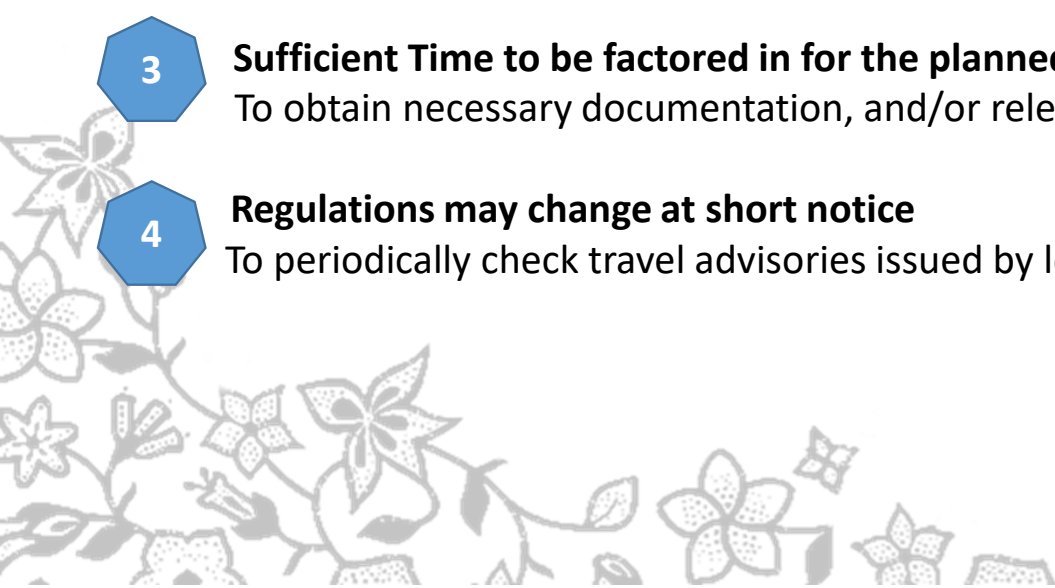
To ensure that all entry requirements are met & to obtain necessary documentation. This should include travel to VTL country, return flight back to Singapore and/ or any other multiple destinations

3 Sufficient Time to be factored in for the planned travel

To obtain necessary documentation, and/or relevant government approvals for their entire planned itinerary

4 Regulations may change at short notice

To periodically check travel advisories issued by local authorities before their trip



Inbound travel from all countries to Singapore via non-VTL Flights / VTL Flights

Singapore classifies all countries into 4 different categories, with different Stay Home Notice (SHN) and testing requirements.

Changes to On-Arrival Test (OAT) Requirements into Singapore

Effective for passengers arriving and entering Singapore on 26 October 2021, 2359hours onwards

- On-Arrival PCR Test (OAT) is no longer required for passengers who are required to serve Stay Home Notice (SHN), the pre-departure PCR Test (PDT) and exit PCR Test at the end of SHN remains applicable.
- OAT remains required for passengers who are not required to serve SHN, this includes passengers with a 14-day travel history to category 1 countries, passengers on designated VTL flights and passengers from Reciprocal Green Lanes (RGL) countries / regions

1. What is the difference in requirements when flying on a Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL) flight vs a non-VTL flight into Singapore?

Eligible VTL travellers can travel to Singapore from the VTL countries

- For any purpose, including leisure, and
- Do not have to undergo quarantine measures

Key Difference (VTL Flights)

- Short-term visitors and long-term pass holders must apply for a valid [Vaccinated Travel Pass \(VTP\)](#)
- Passengers must be fully vaccinated against Covid-19

On-Arrival / Post-arrival

All VTL travellers, including Singapore citizens and permanent residents, only need to self-isolate until they receive their negative test results

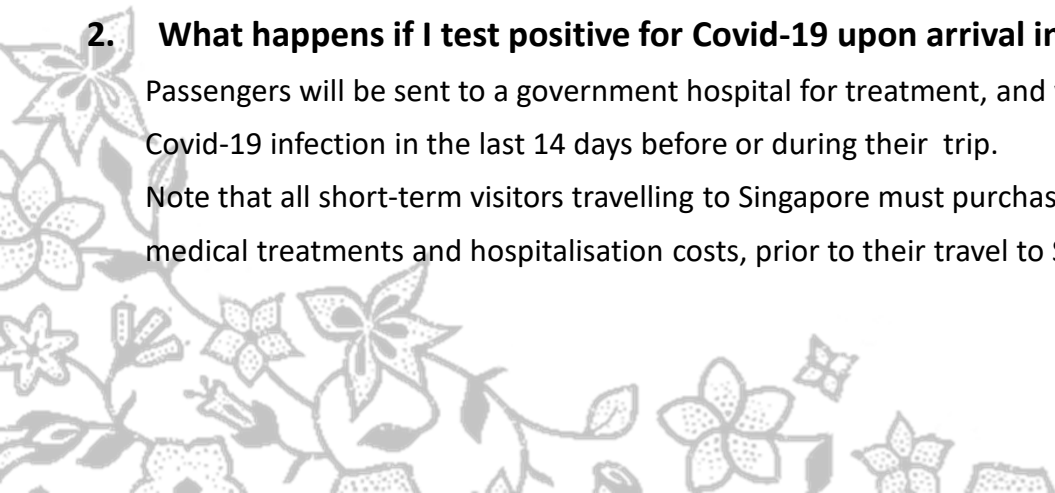
Non-VTL customers

- Required to serve a Stay Home Notice/quarantine at their residence or a designated facility.
- Will be subject to quarantine measures/Stay-Home Notice in Singapore

2. What happens if I test positive for Covid-19 upon arrival in Singapore or before my return flight?

Passengers will be sent to a government hospital for treatment, and will not be allowed to board the aircraft if diagnosed or suspected to have Covid-19 infection in the last 14 days before or during their trip.

Note that all short-term visitors travelling to Singapore must purchase travel insurance with a minimum coverage of S\$30,000 for Covid-19 related medical treatments and hospitalisation costs, prior to their travel to Singapore



Passenger's flight is converted to a designated VTL flight and passenger is not eligible for VTL (not been vaccinated / not fully vaccinated / invalid proof of vaccination)

Follow up action:

If the passenger does not meet VTL eligibility criteria and requirements, please contact your local Sales Ops team [Italy_Salesupport@singaporeair.com.sg] or Sales Office for re-accommodation.

Our crew
